
Romans 8:26-27

I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever—the Spirit of truth.








The Holy Spirit is the divine helper who does not work instead of us or in spite of us; he works in us, through us and with us.

The intercession of the Holy Spirit in prayer for us "as the Divine in us appealing to the Divine above us."


Hebrews 7:24-25

I Corinthians 1:10b - 12

The Spirit knows the mind of God, the will of God, God's purpose for our lives.



The Holy Spirit translates our inarticulate or painful groaning, our requests that are off the wall, and our good efforts in prayer into effective and earnest requests to the Father.

Roman 8:27

The Spirit intercedes for us with groans that words cannot express or wordless groans.



Romans 8:14

For those who are led by the Spirit are the children of God.



Nothing is too trivial for omniscience. Come straight to God. Lay all questions naked before him and he will make it plain to you what his will is.



1. Sometimes through a still small voice.

- 2. Sometimes he prompts us Isaiah 30:21
 - a. He prompted Ananias to pray for Saul. Acts 9:10-11
 - b. He prompted Philip to share with the Ethiopian official. Acts 8:29-30
